

TRANSPORT AND TRAFFIC INFRASTRUCTURE WORKING GROUP Terms of Reference

(Adopted on 8th December 2021)

The aim of the Transport and Traffic Infrastructure Working Group (TTIWG) is to respond to the amount of transport and traffic issues impacting the village of Great Shelford and help the council define a community-led position to the individual and cumulative impact of these issues.

- 1. The Working Group will be subject to reconstitution annually at the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council.
- 2. The Working Group shall consist of not less than **six** members consisting of a minimum of three parish councillors and residents of the village.
- 3. The Working Group of the Committee shall be **three** Members.
- 4. The Working Group will meet every two weeks on a Thursday evening.
- 5. The Working Group will be responsible for the following:
 - a) Making recommendations to the parish council relating to consultations with parishioners on the many traffic and transport issues that are currently proposed and which impact Great Shelford, already suffering from numerous traffic problems. Some of these issues are initiatives upon which the Council is invited to consult, others are proactive measures that the Council can consider to improve village life.
 - b) Looking strategically at the cumulative picture and interdependence of the issues in order to inform and recommend consultation
 - c) Help with implementation when there is a council agreed position.
 - d) To consider the current issues facing the village including but not limited to:
 - Traffic overload and high risk on current roadway infrastructure;
 - East West Rail (EWR);
 - Greater Cambridge Partnership's CSET (Cambridge South East Transport);
 - Cambridge South railway station;
 - Shepreth Branch Junction;
 - Sawston Greenway;
 - Potential reopening of the Cambridge to Haverhill railway line; and
 - Other transport issues facing the village.
 - e) To proactively identify transport and access aspirations of the local community, not just coordinating a response to those presented to the council.
 - f) To provide reports to Full Council on discussions and recommendations for Council to make a decision on.
- 6. The Terms of Reference under which this Working Group operates will be reviewed in each scheduled Parish Election year, or annually if the Council so require, at the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council.
- 7. The Parish Council's adopted Code of Conduct retain precedence over these Terms of Reference.
